
SERVICES THIS SUNDAY - 15 FEBRUARY

On Sunday we will hear something of the work of the Methodist Church World Mission Partnership.


There will be envelopes to support this work in the pews.

We would ask for your patience and understanding as this is unavoidable.




VALENTINE'S HOEDOWN!


Unfortunately, due to the building work, there will be no Short Mat Bowls on Tuesdays in the coming weeks





BUILDING ON FIRM FOUNDATIONS

NAMIBIA

As mentioned in the services a couple of Sundays ago, while the work continues on our own church buildings, we are also supporting the congregation of Bethlehem Methodist Church in Oisre Refugee Camp in Namibia. Following storm damage and the need for a bigger building they need to complete a new roof and put in a concrete floor which they do not have the funds for.

If you wish to support this project financially, you can do so in a number of ways:

1. **Special envelopes** will be available at the Hoedown and in church this weekend. These will give the option of having Gift Aid reclaimed on your donation.





Brighter Days – An Evening of Hope & Wellbeing


An uplifting evening of conversation, music and inspiration!
