
This Sunday there will be two Services at 10.00 am and 11.30 am.





Please remember Jim, Becky and the family in your prayers. Her funeral will be in Seymour Street on Wednesday 11 February at 12.30 pm.






As mentioned in the services last Sunday, while the work continues on our own church buildings, we are also supporting the congregation of Bethlehem Methodist Church in Osire Refugee Camp in Namibia. Following storm damage and the need for a bigger building they need to complete a new roof and put in a concrete floor which they do not have the funds for.
